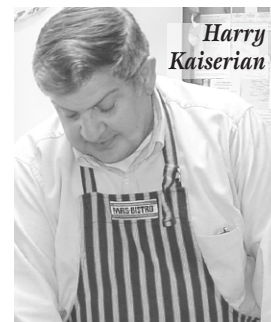

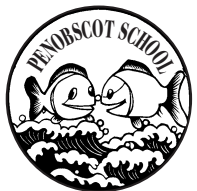

IMMERSIONS

By far, the best way to make rapid progress in any language is to live it, or be immersed in it. Language immersion programs at Penobscot School provide work in the classroom on vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation, all in a relaxed atmosphere, where you will have the opportunity to converse as you participate in everyday activities — just as you would if you were living in a foreign country. Immersions feature native-speaking instructors and assistants, plus up-to-date cultural information. Note registration form for fees and times. Students in weekly courses receive a 15% discount. Beginner immersion days are conducted in English and the target language.

IMMERSION

FEES (Students in weekly courses, students of Let's Talk Language School and FLAME members receive a 15% discount on most immersions)

Italian for Travelers: Held on two consecutive Saturdays, 10 AM-4 PM, \$170 fee for both days or \$108 fee for one day, includes instruction, materials and lunch.

French and Spanish for Travelers: 10 AM-4 PM, \$108 fee includes instruction, materials and lunch.

Saturday Immersions: 10 AM-4 PM, \$108 fee includes instruction, materials and lunch.

Saturday Workshops: 10 AM-2 PM, \$65 fee includes instruction, materials and lunch.

Italian Cooking Class: Taught in English, Saturdays, 10 AM-2 PM, \$45 fee per class or \$40 fee, if pre-registered for two or more classes.

Weekend Immersions: For intermediate to advanced students, Friday 5 PM - Sunday 2 PM, \$219 fee includes instruction,

all activities and materials, accommodation at the William Pitts House, and six meals from Friday dinner through Sunday lunch. Students may choose other accommodations at their own cost. Students may register for Saturday of a weekend immersion at the discretion of instructor. The day begins at breakfast, and Saturday students are welcome to stay through dinner and evening activities, \$108 fee, 8:30 AM - 9 PM.

"In the Woods" Immersion Weekends in Spanish, French and German are offered each fall. These courses attract adults and high school students in equal numbers and they are excellent bridges over the generation gap. "Woods" events feature rustic cabin living, outdoor activities, and cultural studies with native-speaking teachers and volunteers. Weekends start on Fridays at 5 PM and run through Sundays at 2 PM. \$155 fee for adults; \$125 fee for high school students. Youth scholarships and 2.5 CEUs are available. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Payment for weekly and immersion courses may be made by cash, personal check, VISA or MasterCard. You may register in person, by email, surface mail, or phone (207-594-1084).

WEEKLY COURSES: Please complete the registration form; payment must accompany registration. Withdrawal from a course at any time during the first week of class permits full refund, less \$10 administration fee. Withdrawals after the first week of class may receive tuition credit toward classes offered during the following two semesters.

IMMERSION COURSES: Please complete the registration form; payment must accompany registration. Registration Deadline: 4 PM, Monday of the week the course starts. Fees for weekend immersion courses are refundable, less \$20 administration fee, if requested by registration deadline.

POLICY FOR LOW ENROLLMENT CLASSES: In most cases, a course requires a minimum of five students. If a class is canceled, students may register for another class or request a full refund.

LEVELS: We attempt to enroll students in classes that match skill level; however, class levels are approximate and mixed. Please contact the school or course instructor with

CEU CREDIT: Teachers can receive Continuing Education Units for Saturday immersion courses - 0.6 and weekend immersion courses - 2.2. An additional \$10 processing fee is required upon registration. Application deadline is two weeks prior to start of program.
